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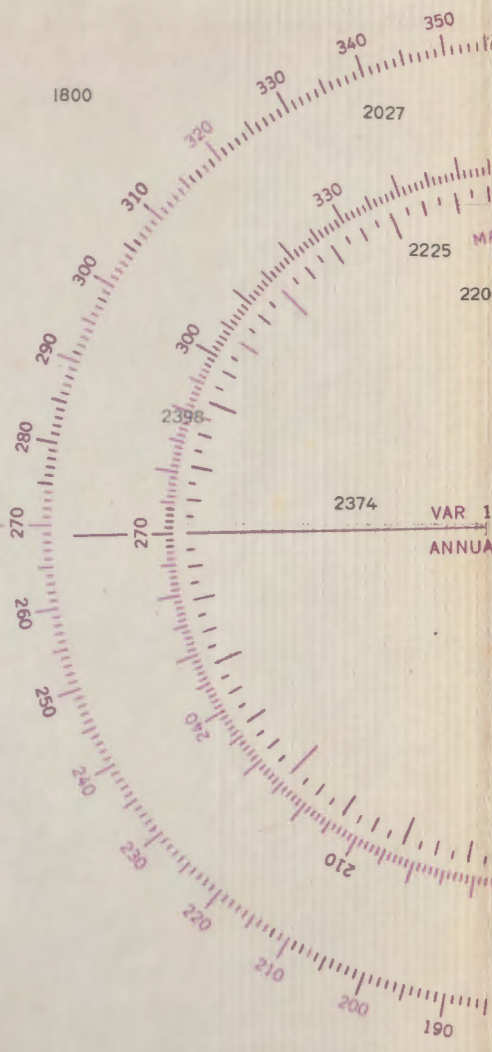
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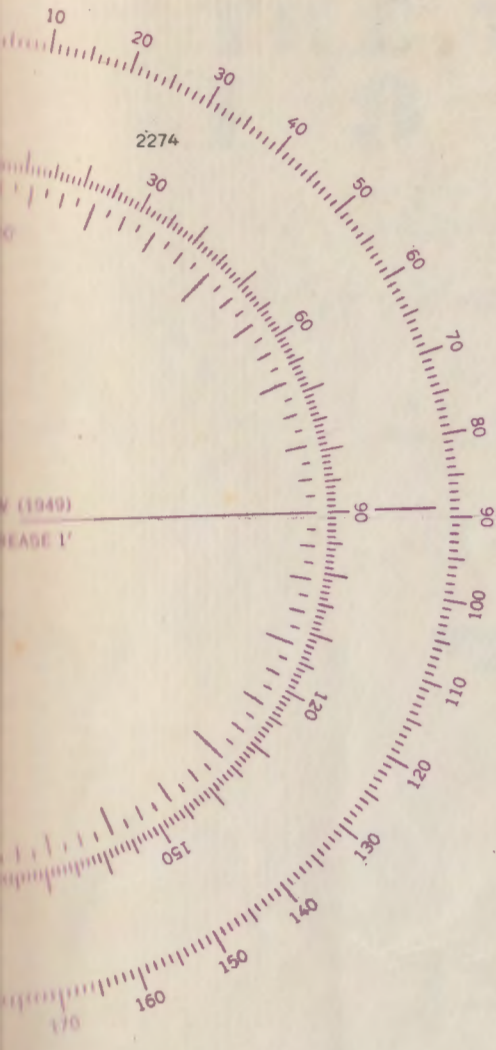
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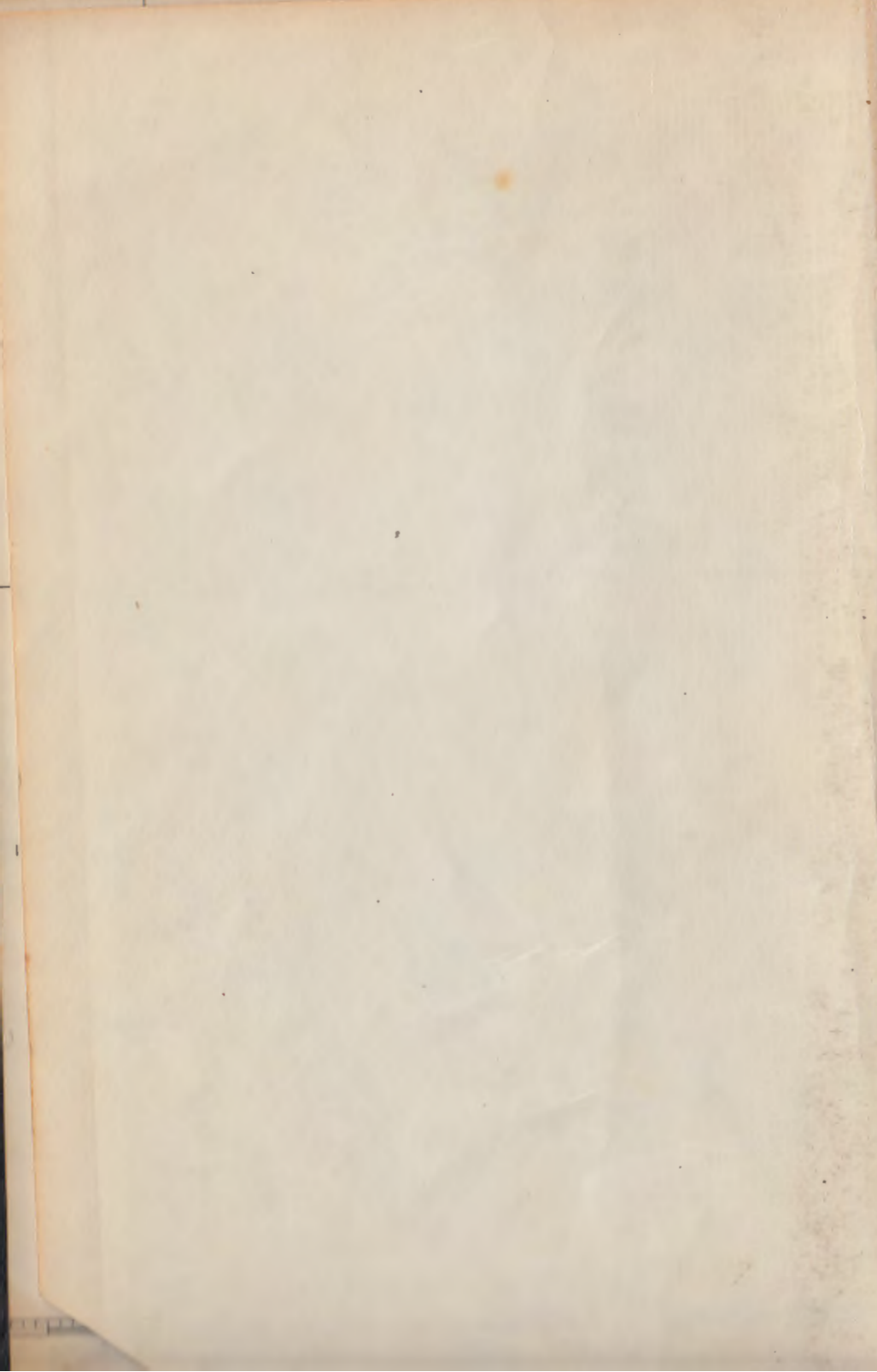

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THIRTEEN-PERIOD CALENDAR FOR 1938

For a number of years the practice of dividing the year into 13 periods of 4 weeks each has been gaining favor in business. Divided this way, any period is directly comparable to any other period.

The varying number of calendar days, working days, Saturdays, etc., in different months of the ordinary 12 month calendar often distorts seriously such vital statistics of business as sales, costs, production, payrolls, etc. For National Dairy users who record such facts on a weekly or four weekly basis, the 1938 Official 13 period calendar is presented by courtesy of the International Fixed Calendar League, Rochester, N. Y.


Please accept our thanks for the report and our appreciation of the good will which prompted you to furnish it for our information.

These fish on SW bank are peculiar because they almost refuse to bite except during the middle of the day. Usually a few can be caught on the anchorage at daylight but not many. The bank is very small and the fish are usually caught only near the 60 fathom depth. (See note on other page for 3 poles)

The large Tuna are not always seen at first but they are usually below the small Tuna and skipjack. At times it is quite difficult to make the big fish bite but with patience and coaxing with bait in small quantities they can be made to come up. When they do come up they bite good. We have even caught many of them on dead sardines. The skipjacks refusing the dead bait.

Bait used was medium sized sardines from San Quentin.

Practically the same conditions existed at this bank during February as in January.

Huge schools of Tuna were observed every day. Some schools actually ocres in area. The small fish usually on the surface, although many schools of large fish were observed

The large fish are slow in coming up to bait but believe they would come if sufficient bait were on hand to chum heavily. We have never experienced this condition. Either we had little bait or what we had was dying rapidly.

Could load skipjacks here in 3 or 4 days!!!

All bait used this month was large sardines taken from positions from 3 to 5 miles offshore between Blanco Point and Playa Maria. These were beautiful large sardines but they would only live a few days, becoming bloodshot & turning over.

Third and fourth class matter may be closed against inspection when wrapper bears authorized printed indicia. If sealed without indicia, parcels are subject to first class rate.

SIZE OF PARCEL POST PACKAGES

Parcels must not exceed 100 inches in length and girth combined. For parcels measuring more than 84 inches but not more than 100 inches in length and girth combined, the minimum charge shall be the rate for a 10 pound parcel. The maximum weight limit is 70 pounds to all zones.

Letter postage for all foreign countries in the following list is 3c. per oz.; Argentina, Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Columbia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Guatemala, Haiti, Honduras, Mexico, Newfoundland, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Salvador, Spain and Colonies, Uruguay and Venezuela.

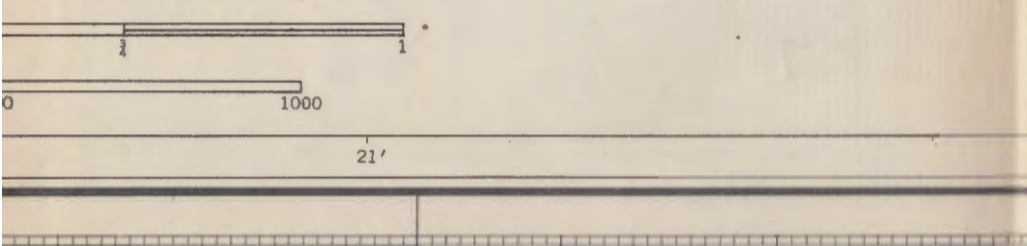
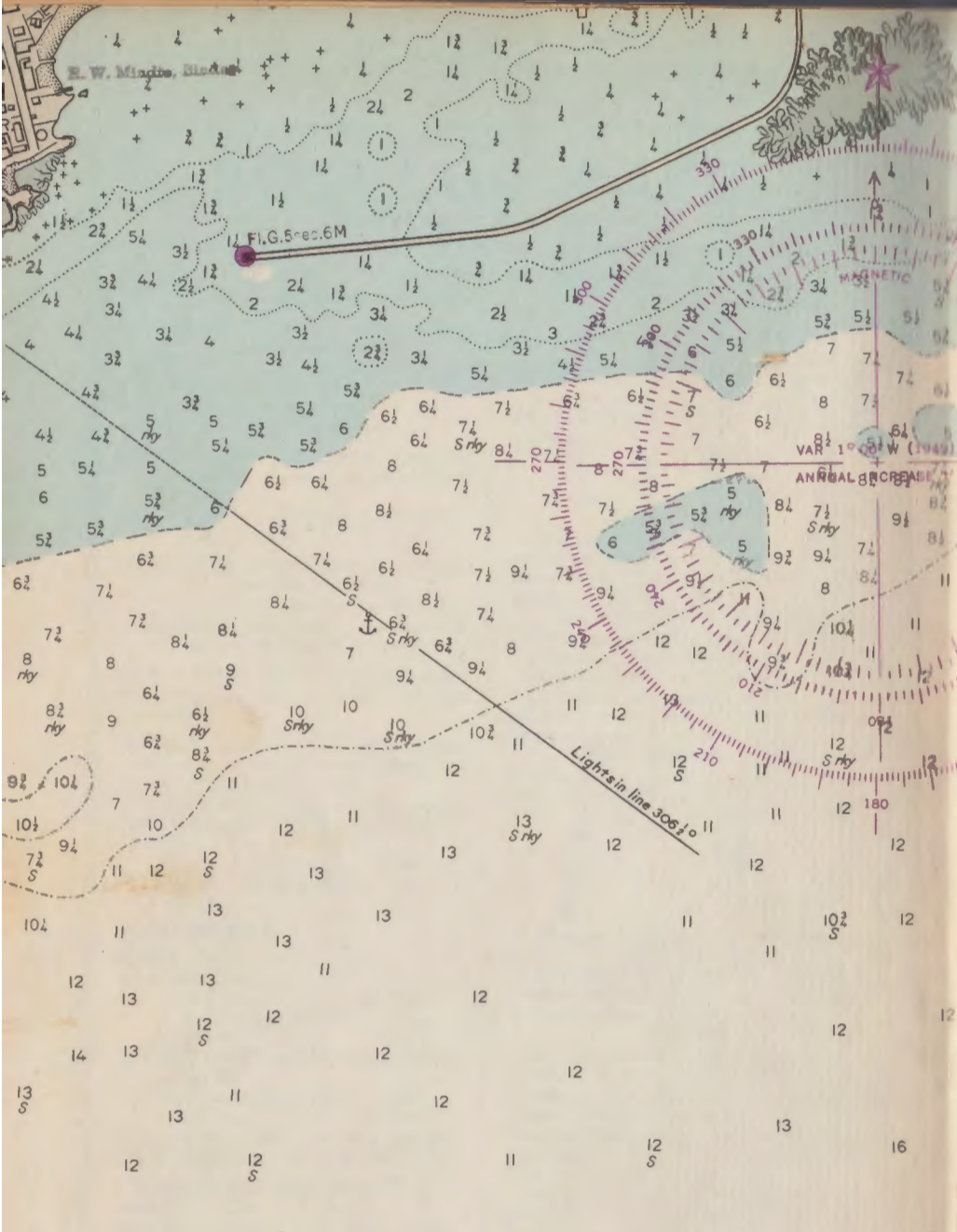
